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Basic concepts

Impairment - Any loss or abnormality of psychological, physiological, or anatomical structure or function Disability - Any restriction or lack of ability to perform an activity in the manner or within the range considered normal for a human being

Handicap - A <disadvantage> for a given individual, resulting from an impairment or disability, that limits or prevents the fulfillment of a role that is normal, <depending on age, sex, social and cultural factors>, for that individual

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Equal Learning Opportunities

1997: The Education Department launched a 2 year pilot project

A whole school approach to integrate children with special educational needs into ordinary schools

2001: The EOC issued the Code of Practice (CoP) on Education

The CoP on Education under the Disability Discrimination Ordinance came into effect to facilitate inclusion in schools

Effective date : 6 July 2001

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Aims

- A. Prevent and eliminate discrimination
- B. Provide practical guidelines
- C. Explain rights and responsibilities

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Application

- A. Educational establishments
- B. School heads, teachers, and other staff
- C. Related professionals

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Definition of Disability

- A. total or partial loss of bodily or mental functions
- B. total or partial loss of a part of the body
- C. presence in the body of organisms causing, or capable of causing, disease or illness
- D. malfunction, malformation or disfigurement of a part of the body
- E. a disorder or malfunction that results in the person learning differently
- F. a disorder, illness or disease that affects thought processes, perception of reality, emotions or judgment or that results in disturbed behaviour

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Disability Discrimination

- Direct
- Indirect
- Harassment
- Victimization
- Vilification
- Serious vilification

Direct Discrimination

Treating a person less favourably on the ground of the person's disability

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Indirect Discrimination

- Applying same requirements or conditions
- Lesser proportion of PWDs can comply
- To PWDs' detriment

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Disability Harassment

- On the ground of disability
- Engage in unwelcome conduct
- Offended, humiliated or intimidated
- Reasonable person test

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Vilification

Activity in public

- → Incite hatred towards / Serious contempt for / Severe ridicule of
- → PWDs

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Serious Vilification

- Intentionally
- Threatening physical harm or inciting others to threaten physical harm

Penalty: \$50001 - 100000 and imprisonment for 2 years

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Victimization

Treats the person victimized less favourably because he/she:

- brought proceedings
- given evidence or information
- otherwise done anything under or by reference to the DDO
- alleged that someone has committed an act which (whether or not the allegation so states) would amount to a contravention of the DDO

Disability Discrimination in Education

- Refusing admission
- In the terms and conditions on which it is prepared to admit that person as a student
- Denying or limiting access to any benefit, service or facility provided
- Expelling
- Any other detriment
