- F. Maintain & update database on disabled students
- G. Raise disability awareness within the University

Challenges Encountered in Supporting Students with Disabilities

- 1 Increasing student number and diversity of disabilities
- 2013-14: a student with multiple disabilities
- 2014-15: 2 students with hearing impairment using sign languages for communication
- 2 Logistic and manpower support
- Limited availability of certain equipment in some parts of the campus
- Some support services, such as conversion of course materials and electronic text production, require a large amount of manpower support
- 3 Professional support
- As students' disabilities become more diversified, there is increasing demand for professional support, such as sign language interpretation and professional consultation
- 4 Disability awareness among campus community
- The overall disability awareness has yet to be enhanced
